



"The primary instrument for Renewable Resource Management in the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Traditional Territory."

The Dawson District Renewable Resources Council (DDRRRC) intends to hire two (2) youths for an amazing summer work and learning opportunity:

Term: Fixed-term employment from June 15th - June 30th, 2026.

Wage: \$20/hour. Flex hours.

The Project: Youth employed will help capture and restore juvenile Chinook salmon. Every Klondike and Yukon Chinook salmon restored has a positive impact on the species and the health of river watershed ecosystems. Local salmon knowledge experts will be mentoring youth out in the field.

Paid / Supervised Duties and Responsibilities:

- Travel to and from various locations along the Yukon, Fortymile and Klondike Rivers.
- Ensure proper trap setting, fish handling and safety protocols are followed.
- Record and analyze salmon capture data including use of GPS and drone technology.

Schedule:

- **June 15** – Introductions / Orientation
- **June 16-19:** Canoeing to Fortymile to observe and hopefully confirm salmon salvage and rearing locations. Accommodations provided at Clinton Creek Mine Site (Earl and Sandy's).
- **June 22-26:** We'll be spending our time between the DDRRC office and Germain Creek mapping an avulsion using a drone. We'll also be conducting some in river/stream sampling and doing some canoeing down the Klondike River if conditions are safe and time permits.
- **June 29:** We'll be conducting Chinook salmon salvage activities in the Germain Creek avulsion if salmon are observed. We will also visit the TH Sonar Station.
- **June 30:** Chinook salmon salvage activities continued. We'll also be hiring a bus and driver to take members of the public out to Germaine Creek to observe activities for the afternoon.

Who Can Apply: Applicants must be a resident of Dawson City or surrounding area aged 14 to 20. Successful applicants and a parent or guardian will be required to sign a liability waiver and employment contract before commencing the program.
